English

This term we will be sharing a range of stories linked to our Autumnal topic. Our Key Texts include: The Gruffalo, The Gruffalo's Child, Stick Man, The Snow Man, non fiction information about hibernation and The Nativity Story. This will enable us to:

- enjoy rhyming and rhythmic activities through stories, poems and songs
- show an awareness of rhyme and alliteration
- listen to stories with increasing attention and recall
- describe main story settings, events and principal characters

We will be using our Phonic knowledge to write for a variety of purposes and in different contexts. This will enable us to:

- hear and say the initial sounds in words
- link sounds to letters naming and sounding letters of the alphabet
- use some clearly identifiable letters to communicate meaning

Expressive Arts and Design

Through taking part in a range of creative based activities we will:

- explore what happens when we mix colours
- experiment to create different textures
- manipulate materials to achieve a planned effect
- choose colours to use for a purpose
- introduce a story line or narrative into our play

Understanding The World

We will explore the world around us and:

- join in with family customs and routines
- comment and ask questions about the world around us
- talk about why things happen and how things work
- develop an understanding of growth, decay and changes over time
