News from the Headteacher


Are you all sitting comfortably? Then I'll begin. This week is National Storytelling Week and the children have enjoyed listening to different stories in many formats. We all watched Michael Rosen read 'We're going on a bear hunt' in assembly and throughout the week we have had parents and staff sharing their favourite stories. The library has been well-used all week which is exactly what we want. Hopefully seeing adults read is inspiring the children to want to read. If you want to continue coming in to read to the children please do. It doesn't have to be confined to one week a year.

We have welcomed another teaching student in Reception this week Miss Sheridan. We hope she has a great time here at Stratford and leaves us with excellent practice. The children have enjoyed cooking gingerbread men and learning this age old traditional tale with Miss Sheridan. We also welcomed children from Grange Park school in Telford; a primary school who are part of our trust. It was an opportunity for Year 4 to learn new skills from them using microbits and for us to share our Shakespeare heritage with them. Year 4 are looking forward to visiting them in the summer and learning all about Ironbridge and Isambard Kingdom Brunel as well learning more about the microbits. Year 3 also had a visit from Dr Dale who taught them all about geology and rocks. The children were fascinated by the different types and how they are formed. I was able to spend Wednesday playtimes in the paddock with the children this week. It was so lovely to watch them at play building dens, collecting bugs and sticks, playing different games. I am so pleased we are able to utilise this great resource. If you are able to help with crossing the road and escorting the children back and forth on a regular basis each Wednesday we would appreciate an extra body or two. We also welcomed Rev Patrick from Holy Trinity Church who led an assembly on the parable of the good and bad seed. This reinforced our message of keep on trying and can do attitudes. Y6 were invited to The Swan Theatre this week to watch the dress rehearsal of Julius Caesar. It was extremely engaging and the children got to be citizens of Rome through audience participation. It is good for them to see live performances and be immersed in drama.


As you know we are continuously monitoring effectiveness and this week I have been observing the quality of teaching and learning. It is an excellent opportunity to observe the pupils at work and how they respond to the curriculum. The children have great learning behaviours and demonstrate enthusiasm and perseverance. We have been enhancing English lessons with drama/role play activities. This means that the children's vocabulary and explanations have increased ten-fold. All of the children are engaged and understand what they are learning. We continue to develop challenges and independent learning. The local governing body have also met this week and their focus was data and the progress of the children. The new LGB is very committed and are currently planning visits to the school to talk to the children, look for evidence of how inspirational is the curriculum, behaviour and much more. FOSPs also met this week for their AGM and the committee was re-elected. Thank you for those who came to the meeting. The locs of plans for events which they will share with you and the teachers were very excited to receive £150 each to spend on resources for the classroom such as art resources. A massive thank you from them all.
