Develop your creativity:

- Make a miniature seashore rockpool using natural materials such as pebbles, twigs, sand and shells.
- Create a collage of a seaside scene using magazine pages.
- Make a 3-D sea animal. You can use any material you like perhaps papier mâché, fabric, plastic bottles, clay, play dough or Lego pieces?
- Design, draw and paint a picture of a beach hut.
- Create a hamper basket you would take to the beach.
 What food and drinks would you put inside? What else might you bring?

Hand in: Monday 16th July



Children should complete 1 or 2 pieces of depth work. Children will present their work to the class where they can be awarded up to 10 stars in total.

Explore your research and writing skills:

- With an adult, use the web to research famous artists who use the beach for inspiration - write some facts about them and try to re-create their art work.
- Look at holiday brochures or travel website. Find out which seas or oceans are close to each destination. Locate them on a map. Find out what the weather is like and when it is the best time to visit. How is it different from home? Report your findings to the class.

Build on your investigation skills:

- Bring pictures from home of yourself or family members at the seaside. Can you identify the location on a map? What other beaches, seas and oceans are near it?
- Make a list of all the activities you could do at the seashore. Survery your friends and family to identify the 'Top five seashore activites' and display the results in a pictogram or bar chart.
