Year 3 were amazing as they had to perform in front of Shakespeare's birthplace and country danced their hearts out. We received lots of positive feedback as to how professional they were. Thank you so much to Mr Moss and Mrs Hill who have honed the children's dancing skills and also to Mrs Fade and Mrs Hill who gave up their own time to be with the children on Saturday. We also held a Science fair on Tuesday in school. Many of our pupils had spent the last week at home being engineers of the future and designing prototype inventions. The hall was packed with a range of quite inventive designs. Mrs Ingate (Science Co-ordinator) and myself had quite a job judging them. It was extremely challenging. We talked to the children about their designs, judged creativity, was there a hypothesis behind their design and more. What impressed us particularly was how many of the inventions were linked to sustainability and helping the homeless. What philanthropic children we have. If I could have had my way all of the children should have gone through to the grand final at Stratford High but we had to send a boy and a girl from each year group. You can see the winners in this week's news. However, we have to say a huge congratulations to Isla in Y2 and Hetty, Amaya and Wren in Y4 who were one of 18 children who represented our school at the final and they won in their categories. Mrs Ingate said how impressed she was with the behaviour of all our pupils at the final and how articulate they were. Mrs Ferries (community governor) sent me the following message 'I just wanted to drop you a quick note to say how proud the children did themselves, the school and the parents at the science fair at the high school this afternoon. They were all incredible; behaviour was fantastic and they showed themselves to be intelligent, articulate and interesting young individuals.'

We are currently developing our environment to be maths rich. In each classroom children have access to maths top tips, a variety of resources and interactive questions.
