## News from the Headteacher

Week three and despite the rain and wind there are lots of smiles in the school. The children are enjoying exploring their new topics and being creative. Year 5 explained all about gold to me when I popped in the other day. It was fascinating them. Did you know gold can bend? Apparently when it is in a certain state it definitely can. Year 5 also enjoyed a visit from an engineer who shared his design for a flying car. The children were inspired to create their own designs. Enjoy the photographs in this newsletter. Year One have been exploring London city skylines. There is some excellent artwork to demonstrate their understanding and Year Two have been wowing Miss O'Connell with their writing of Midsummer Night's Dream. Their understanding of the words and language is enhancing their lives. It isn't unusual to hear the words such as 'infuriated' or 'slumbering' being uttered in the classroom.

Last week Miss Gill and I were able to attend an early years conference which has inspired us in our passion for making our Reception unit outstanding. Throughout the day we explored how children learn and how they develop skills. Too often in early years children are given opportunities which only aid them in using skills already learnt when they are toddlers. An outstanding unit will plan learning that helps them to progress those skills. For example instead of all of the children painting a picture of a daffodil so you get 30 identical daffodils we will teach them an art skill such as stippling or colour mixing. The children then can choose to paint anything they want using the skill learnt. Miss Gill is looking forward to seeing the children progress as she develops the continuous provision further. Miss O'Connell, Mrs McCormack and Miss Gill have also been working with other colleagues across Warwickshire on moderating children's writing and maths to verify assessments. It has been a busy week.

Wednesdays are now known as 'Playtime in the Paddock' days. All of the children got to go and play in the paddocks either in the morning or at lunchtime. They loved it as did Mr Hodgkins as he was able to supervise a great game of football. We apologise for any muddy trousers but hopefully it washed out. So much fun to be able to use our green space. Next week if your child wants to bring a pair of waterproof trousers or joggers to slip on over their school trousers then please send them in. With any luck next week will be sunny and dry. A huge thank you to Mrs Fade who ensured that it went swimmingly and also to all of the staff for their enthusiasm in implementing a new initiative.

We have welcomed Mr Moss to our team for the next few weeks who is teaching Year 3 in Mrs Ingate's absence. He has settled in well and is enjoying getting to know the class. After one day he came to find me to share the names of all the children who were on the star of excellence. I love good news.
