Develop your creativity:

- Design your own boat. What materials will it be made from? What shape will your boat be? What name will you give it?
- Design a postcard for a place you have visited. Then write about your journey to that place.
- Create a map of your home and local area. Where would be a good place to hide treasure? Plot a route from your home to the treasure.
- Make a pirate treasure chest using a lidded box and other recycled materials. What will you keep in your treasure chest?
- Design and make a costume for a pirate puppet. Label your drawing with why you chose that design.



Children should complete 1 or 2 pieces of depth work. Children will present their work to the class where they can be awarded up to 10 stars in total.

Explore your research and writing skills:

- Search the web or non-fiction books to find out about a famous boat or ship. Make an information book by writing down interesting facts and including images or drawings. Famous ships could be RMS Titanic, Santa Maria, Cutty Sark, HMS Belfast
- Look at holidary brochures or travel website. Find out which seas or oceans are close to each destination. Locate them on a map. Find out what the weather is like and when it the best time to visit. How is it different from home? Report your findings to the class.

Build on your investigation skills:

- Use sticks, straws, pipe cleaners, sticky tape and string to make a raft. How well does it float? What changes could you make for it to float better? Can it float with any extra weight added to it?
- Pick a country far away to travel to. What suitable clothing and items would you need to pack for your expedition and why?
