Well it's been a long two weeks, working from home and not seeing the children in person! It's been so lovely keeping in touch with them via Teams - thank goodness for remote technology, and for Mrs Humphriss' daily telephone conversations, otherwise I think I may have gone ever so slightly mad! Year 2 never cease to amaze me and I am so proud of how well they have carried on with their learning remotely, juggling all their online learning and showing such resilience these past two weeks.

Last week I met with Year 2 and Year 6 online wearing a rather colourful wig for Crazy Hair Day and today I have returned school dressed as an elf! It's never a dull moment. The children looked fantastic today in their elf attire and have had lots of fun taking part in different elf activities all in aid of Alzheimer's UK. Thank you for the super costumes and donations towards this vital cause. The week started with Mrs Humphriss' assembly on Teams and the majority of year 2 were able to join remotely. Bit by bit we are all becoming a little more au fait with this method of working and Miss Parton, Miss Davies and myself have also delivered live lessons this week with great success. It is definitely a different way of teaching but it's lovely to be able to interact with the children and keep in touch. ESchools has also proved to be extremely effective – we have been able to speak to the children and answer any questions about their learning immediately. I have also been able to remotely join in with Reception and Year 1's phonics lessons throughout the week, which has enabled me to carry on with my monitoring role as English Lead and has given me a super insight to the fantastic learning that is taking place this term. 

One of the most enjoyable activities was pretending to be 'squirrels', hiding and finding acorns in the wood. This proved to more challenging than anticipated!


The day was finished off with den making and roasting marshmallows around the fire!
