News from the Headteacher

Dobro pozhalovať v nashu rassylku (Welcome to our newsletter.) This month we are learning Russian. Miss Bradburn and 4 children from KS2 introduced us to Language of the Month, correcting our pronunciation and teaching us key words such as hello, please, thank you, good bye. We learnt about the culture of Russia and enjoyed some music by Tchaikovsky. It is always tricky learning new things but we are persevering and increasing our vocabulary all the time.

Last Friday Mrs Abernethy, Mrs Fade and I took 30 children to the RSC to watch a scene from The Merchant of Venice. We were invited by a group of students who had been learning from the education department at The Royal Shakespeare Company about the whole process of putting on a performance. In two days they learnt how to perform, make costumes and props, how to market the play, how to use light and sound to enhance and the whole nuances of a Shakespeare production. It was brilliant. At one point I was on the edge of my seat as the actors drew you into the play with their acting. Our children certainly enjoyed it and it could be something they get involved in as they grow up.

It has been a busy week here as both Year 3 and 4 went out to Spernal Forest to learn in the outdoors. It couldn't have been two more contrasting days. For Year 3 the sun shone and they skipped, danced and ran through the trees. For Year 4, though the heavens opened and with hail pattering down, they made bread and mushroom soup but came back full of the joys of spring. We also enjoyed some bedtime stories in the hall with a visiting author to start literary festival week and then KS1 learnt how Michelle Robinson wrote the story Ten Fat Sausages! We are continuing our work to promote reading around the school with cosy reading corners so literary week is perfect to remind the children how much comfort and fun books can be. We have also been entertained by our Rock Steady bands this week. I am always amazed at how much the children have progressed every time and how confident they are to stand up and play and sing in front of an audience. James is a great teacher and I know the children who attend have so much fun. Learning an instrument stays with you for life and improves your co-ordination so if your child ever gets the chance to learn one, give it a go. Finally, some of Year 5 have been completing their Bikeability (to those of an older generation - cycling proficiency.) They have been out and about on the surrounding streets learning to cycle safely and negotiate traffic correctly. Well done to them all for perseverance, concentration and determination to succeed.

We have welcomed two new families this week. Emma has joined us in Year 4 and has settled straight in. She told me all about the mushroom soup which she helped make but didn't fancy! Not to everyone's taste but she did enjoy the forest and making new friends. Oscar has started in Reception and was soon chatting with us all about his love of Spiderman. Welcome to both of you and we hope you enjoy being at Stratford Primary.

Miss Gill will soon be leaving us and we will be saying our farewells at church next Thursday. Meanwhile a rigorous recruitment process took place for her replacement. The panel were impressed by Miss Megan Hancock's creativity and vision for children's education. The children loved her active phonic lesson and so Miss Hancock will be joining the team after the Easter holidays and continuing Reception's great progress as they prepare for Year One.

Next week is our final week of the Spring Term as we head towards Easter. Don't forget to join us in church at 1.30 on Thursday.

WhatsApp minimum age is 16. All other social media services require users to be at least 13 years of age to access and use their services. This includes Facebook, Snapchat, Twitter, Instagram, Musically and Skype.
