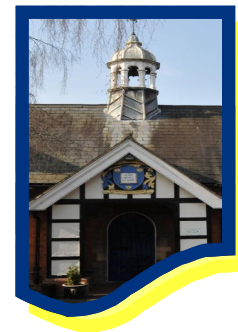

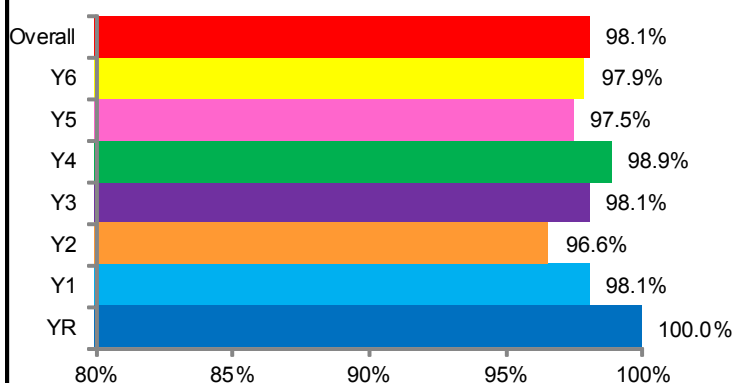

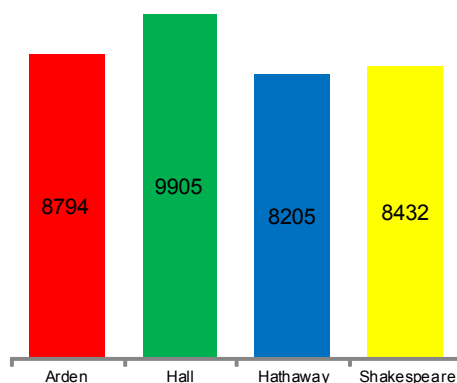

Stratford Foodbank - urgent plea for UHT Milk and UHT Juice and rice.

Currently we are experiencing an unexpectedly high demand for our food parcels. This has put pressure on our food stocks, specifically lines with the shortest shelf life such as UHT Milk and UHT Juice. Supplies of rice are also running low. These items are essential as they enable us to provide nutritionally balanced emergency food parcels to those facing crisis in the Stratford area.

Donations can be left in the Foodbank's collection baskets at Tesco, Morrison's, Waitrose, Budgens in Bidford, and at Holy Trinity church. Items can also be bought directly the Foodbank's warehouse on the carpark at Tesco, opposite the Click 'n' Collect area, on a Monday and Wednesday afternoon between 2.00 and 3.30pm.
