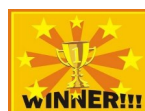
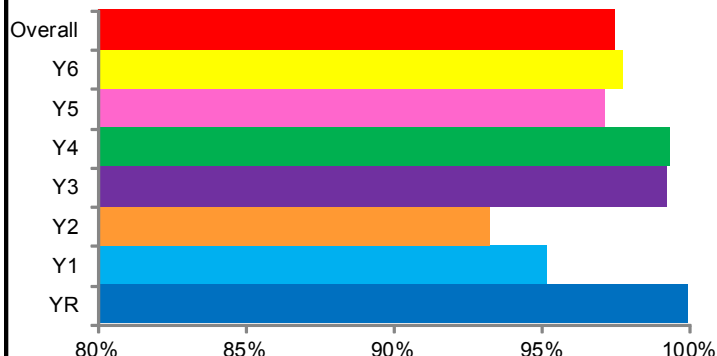

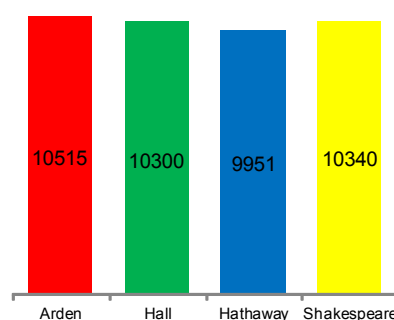

The children were also treated to a fabulous performance of dance and drama. They thoroughly enjoyed it. Great behaviour from Year 5.

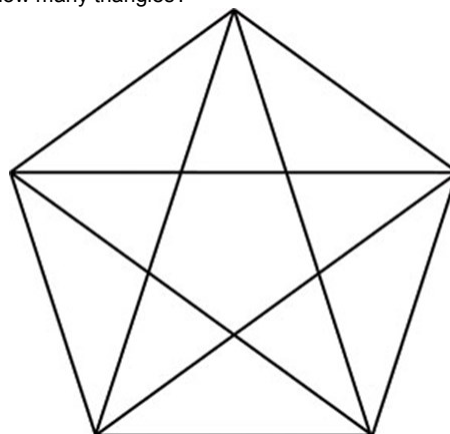
