#### Highlights from the Desk of the Maths Lead...

And what a strangely quiet desk it has been this week, with Year 6 working remotely – again!

It has given me a great opportunity though to pop into other classes – in between hosting live lessons and recording lessons, of course – and see what amazing Maths has been happening ...

Year 1 have been learning about and using the part-whole model to partition and represent numbers, and are always keen to tell me about their Maths. I particularly loved Harrison's explanation about making corrections in his book: "Making mistakes is good because you are still learning." Albert Einstein would agree with you. Harrison!

Year 2 impressed me with their use of their number bonds to ten to perform addition calculations more efficiently. They have been working very hard using different strategies to help them with their arithmetic.

Meanwhile, in Year 4, they have been using the analogy of being an 'eco-wash' when performing column addition: going slowly, carefully and taking their time to ensure their calculations are accurate! It's very true: the best mathematician is not always the fastest to finish ... real life mathematicians can spend years solving a single problem!

Year 4 were also keen to share their newly-introduced role of 'Maths Buddies' who can support others in the class alongside the teacher. The Maths Buddies explained to me that their role is not to tell other children the answers, but to help guide their thinking. A real sign of mastering a concept is being able to explain that concept to someone else.

Year 5 have been wowing everyone with their amazing use of maths vocabulary and by attempting some very tricky multi-step addition and subtraction problems. I was particularly impressed with how beautifully presented their Maths Books are.


Finally, I must mention Year 6 who have really impressed me, Mrs Fade and Mrs Bean this week when revising their written methods for short and long column multiplication. They have dazzled us with their recall, accuracy and understanding; with their ability to apply this to problem solving and reasoning scenarios; and with their amazing contributions during live lessons on Teams.

It has been lovely being able to really experience the progression in calculations across the school and I have also been lucky enough to be able to display some super work on our new Maths Board, which shows the brilliant progression in place value understanding from Reception right through to Year 6. Well done Stratford Primary Mathematicians!
