Dear Parents and Carers,

Updated letter for full school reopening Wednesday 2nd September – attendance is mandatory

Executive Head Teacher: Mrs G Humphriss NPQH, PGCE, BA Hons, QTS,

If you have been on holiday to any of the countries which are now on the quarantine list and are quarantining as a result and will not return next week please let the school office know so we can update our attendance registers.

I hope you are all well. I promised I would re-send my letter from the end of summer with some updates and reminders ready for the children returning next week. We are so looking forward to seeing everyone. The staff have been very busy preparing the school and Mr Hodgkins has been doing his annual decorating. So we have hand sanitizer units around the school, the tables all face forward in Years 2-6 and every child has their own stationery pack and seated area where they can keep all their things. Reception and Year One are set up as Early Years units where children can develop socially, mentally and academically and can access different areas. All children will be regularly washing their hands and taught Catch It, Bin it, Kill it. Face coverings **are not** to be worn in primary school – this guidance is for secondary schools only. Year groups will now be bubbles and have zoned areas for playtime and lunchtime. There will be limited movement around school to avoid contact and windows and doors will be open to allow the flow of fresh air. You can find lots of information on the school website under our new COVID -19 tab including links for booking a test if you have symptoms.

We are ready to go and excited.

## School measures to full reopening

- The school environment will be adapted to maximise the opportunity for social distancing in line with government guidance.
- Children will be in their year groups and in their classrooms. Essentially their year groups will become the new 'bubbles' and year groups will have limited mixing with other year groups in the school.
- The school day will be strictly timetabled for each class and this MUST be adhered to. This
  will include start times, break times, lunch times and collection times. We will not be holding
  whole school assemblies, get –togethers such as topic sharing or any large group gatherings
  for the foreseeable future. This could include Christmas events but will decide this nearer the
  time
- We will maintain our staggered drop off and pick up times although we have adapted these and have detailed them below. The same rules will continue to apply. Only ONE ADULT can accompany children to school and if you need to bring siblings they MUST stay with the adult accompanying the family at all times, maintaining 2m social distance. There will be a strict one-way system. Everyone will queue at the centre gate (opposite the office) where a member of staff will direct you. Please queue on the pavement maintaining distance. Please come on time and move quickly through the queue. Do not gather at the front of the school in groups. We ask that you maintain the social distancing. If you wish to wear a mask you may but children should remove these before entering the school building.













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- Reception, Year One and Year Two children will turn to the right and enter school through the hall door at 8.45am and adults will exit via the gate next to our garden. Pick up will be from the hall at 3.20pm.
- Years Three, Four, Five and Six turn to the left and enter through the playground gates at 8.55am. Adults will not be allowed to enter the playground. Any KS2 child who feels confident to walk round to the gates by themselves will be allowed to. This will reduce the number of people queuing. Pick up will be from the playground gate at 3.30pm.
- School uniform is to be worn and we expect everyone to follow our uniform policy from September. Children should not wear trainers except for PE. On PE days children can come to school in their PE kit to avoid getting changed at school. We will communicate which days these are at the start of term. Can I please ask that coats are of a dark colour e.g. blue/black
- We would prefer that children continue to not bring scooters or bicycles to school for at least September. We will review this after the first month. However, we want to encourage as many of you as possible to please walk to school. Try to park further away from the school and walk in. We will have a greater number of children and adults around school and want to keep them safe from traffic.
- The children will have their own stationery products in school which will be kept at their desk or in a drawer. They do not need a pencil case. Children can bring a small bag to school which will be kept under their desk. We will not be using lockers or cloakrooms for the time being to reduce crowding. They can use the bag to carry their packed lunch, water bottle, reading books and anything else they may need. We will be sending reading books home again in September.
- Handwashing will be a major part of our school day. The children will have access to soap
  and water and also hand sanitisers. They may bring their own if they wish which they must
  look after. Each classroom will have their own cleaning materials and resources, tables, door
  handles etc will be cleaned throughout the day.
- During the school holidays the school has been deep cleaned. Throughout the day areas
  which are shared such as toilets will be cleaned regularly and touch points e.g. door handles
  throughout school will be sprayed.
- Visitors into school will be extremely limited. You will still NOT be able to go to the school
  office. If you wish to contact the school please do so via email or telephone.
- You will also not be able to speak to staff in the way you are used to on arrival and collection. We will start to reintroduce communication books/ me2you form which can be put in book bags each day and shared with staff if necessary. Of course a smile and hello is lovely.
- Class catering will be resuming hot meals; menus have been shared. The children will be on a rota system and will be expected to remain at their lunch table. The lunch hall will be cleaned down between each setting.
- The government guidance is clear that the wearing of PPE by staff and children every day is
  not required unless first aid is being administered. We have an isolation room in school for
  any child or adult that displays symptoms during the school day. PPE is worn by members of
  staff dealing with a suspected case. We will telephone any parent immediately and expect
  you to take your child home, book a test and engage with NHS Test and Trace.
- Should any child need to isolate at home or if any year group closes due to a positive case
  then there will be learning available through e-schools which matches the school curriculum
  and we expect you to engage with this. We will ensure you receive full support should it be
  required.















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- We will be following a broad and balanced curriculum which follows all areas of The National Curriculum. It will also involve a recovery curriculum which is all about building relationships with each other, mental health needs and hygiene. For the first 2 weeks of term the whole school will be following the same key text and producing learning around the Oliver Jeffers book 'Here we are'.
- We are also revisiting our behaviour policy which will be renamed 'Building Relationships policy.' All behaviour is a form of communication and we are always researching ways to support all children in school. We will be displaying different emotions in class which children can refer to and share with an adult why they are feeling that way and learn how to manage that behaviour. We are very much about a positive approach and expect all children to follow our one school rule of RESPECT. More will be shared in the autumn term. Our policy has also been updated around COVID-19 and hygiene. Any child who deliberately coughs, sneezes, spits or touches a child will follow a range of sanctions. We are promoting 'Catch it, bin it, kill it' and expect everyone to follow this and understand the importance of hygiene and staying safe and well. Please talk to your child about this in readiness for September.
- Whilst children will not move between classes, adults can so long as they wash their hands first and maintain a social distance. This will allow us to operate interventions, specialist lessons such as music.
- Warwickshire music will not be doing face to face lesson for the first half of Autumn term.
   However, rock steady will restart. They are also following strict guidance and will ensure children maintain social distance and have reduced contact with resources. After school clubs will be reviewed as the term goes on. For now there will not be any after school provision.

Please be aware that should there be a local outbreak we may be required to immediately close and so our e-schools facility will be ready for you and we will then return to only staying open for keyworker children only until we are told to re-open.

Please be re-assured we are doing everything we can in line with government guidance to keep children, staff and parents safe. We will continue to communicate with you as and when is necessary and look forward to our community being back together once again next week.
