

English

This term we will be sharing a range of stories linked to our Traditional Tales topic. Our Key Texts include: Jack and the Beanstalk, The Three Little Pigs and Goldilocks and The Three Bears.

This will enable us to:

- describe main story settings, events and principal characters
- enjoy an increasing range of books
- write with different purposes.

We will be using our Phonic knowledge to write for a variety of purposes and in different contexts. This will enable us to:

- be able to segment the sounds in simple words and blend them together and know which letters represent some of them.
- use some clearly identifiable letters to communicate meaning
- hear and say the initial sound in words.

Maths

Using the Maths Mastery approach to learning we will have daily Maths Meetings focusing on various areas of the Maths curriculum including; numbers within 20, doubling and halving, shape and pattern and addition and subtraction.

The focus work will include:

- part, part whole models
- 2d and 3d shapes
- more and fewer

Expressive Arts and Design

The creative activities carried out will allow us to:

- explore the different sounds of instruments
- manipulate materials to achieve a planned effect
- choose colours to use for a purpose
- Selects tools and techniques needed to shape, assemble and join materials they are using.

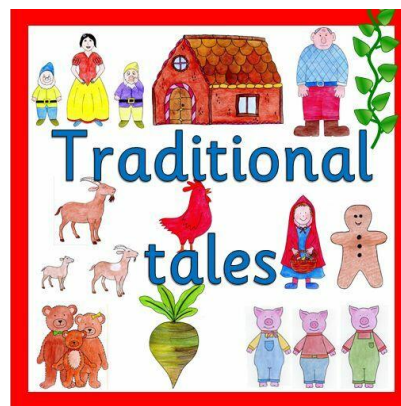
Understanding The World
