SAFEGUARDING - IS EVERYONE'S RESPONSIBILITY



None of us were taught how to be parents and sometimes we may find what we're doing isn't working or we just want some different strategies in our toolbox. In Warwickshire, parents to be, parents, carers and grandparents have access to a variety of parenting resources and advice. Support can be accessed online, face-to-face through informal advice, one-to-one consultations, group programmes and workshops.

This is part of the information, advice and support that is often referred to as 'universal support' or 'early help' as it is freely available to all families. Early help is about helping families deal with any issues as early as possible. It is a spectrum of support that ranges from information, advice and support that families can access themselves through to more individualised or targeted support.

All children, young people and families in Warwickshire are entitled to receive early help at any point in a child's life, from the foundation years through to the teenage years.

All our teachers are trained in Early Help – you are not alone – reach out for support.

Some of our children also got to visit our local library and are participating in a programme called Chatterbooks. It is being led by Stratford Library and they aim to promote a love of reading for all. When did you last visit the library. Our governors visited us on Friday and talked to pupils about how safe they feel. They asked the children if they had a trusted adult to talk to in school, have they experienced bullying, prejudice or harassment, how safe they felt on a daily basis and to describe a typical day at Stratford Primary. In an hour they managed to talk to about 15 children (7%). The children all felt safe and said bullying is extremely rare and they loved Stratford Primary. Our governors play an important part in ensuring our school meets the vision and values we promote. This week we have a trust safeguarding review as part of our ongoing commitment to making sure our children have the best education possible for their future.
