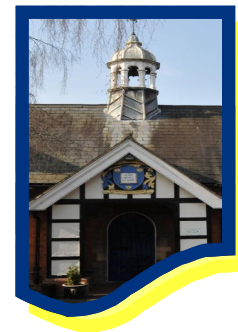

News from the Headteacher

néih hóu – Hello in Cantonese, our language of the month. Thanks to Jun in Year 6 we started our first week of the summer term learning some basic words to help us to communicate in another language. We all talked about how important it is to learn different languages as we live in a very diverse community and communicating and talking to each other is key to a successful society. So dòjeh Jun – thank you for teaching us.

This week we have also been focussing as a whole school on our one school rule of respect, remembering that a smile costs absolutely nothing and raises spirits all round. The children have been focussed on moving calmly and quietly through the corridors, holding doors open and saying good morning or good afternoon to each other. All of the staff model good behaviour to all the children each day and support them to learn to play well with each other. It has been great seeing Year 3 learn to use the wheel of conflict as part of their work on learning about Romeo and Juliet and discuss how different situations can be solved. They have considered how the ongoing feud between The Montagues and The Capulets could be applied to conflict today and think about resolutions. So, for example, they have thought about being in the playground and what if someone comes up and kicks them, before exploding themselves what could they do? Could they find out why it happened? Was it an accident or deliberate? Do they deal with it by themselves or seek an adult? Did they do something first that resulted in a kick? Nothing is ever black and white and there is always a bigger picture, remember that! Children fall out. It is a fact of life and we all need to learn acceptance and resolutions.

On Tuesday evening Miss Hancock, Mrs Hill and myself welcomed our new parents of Reception children who will be joining us in September. It was lovely to meet everyone and spend a little time getting to know them. It was an opportunity for us to share key information about EYFS and our school and give them an opportunity to ask any questions and take a look at our unit. We are looking forward to next week when the children will come with their parents for a stay and play session. We love meeting our new Reception children.

So, what has been happening in the classrooms this week? Year 5 and 6 have started preparations for their play 'Pirates of The Curry Bean' it sounds like it is going to be an explosive performance! Year 5 have been learning all about translating shapes and coordinates. I think they have found this quite tricky but have persevered. I loved visiting Year 4 this week and seeing how knowledgeable they are about adverbs, personification, similes and metaphors and they have written some terrific haikus about the ocean. If you don't know what a haiku is then ask a Year 4 child. Year 3 are exploring Romeo and Juliet and Year 2 went over to forest school this week with Mr Gardner, they loved visiting the woods and are looking forward to their weekly visits. In Year one, they have been really developing their phonic knowledge and have been learning all about London and in Reception they have had great fun starting their underwater topic and made some excellent glittery fish and written about sharks.

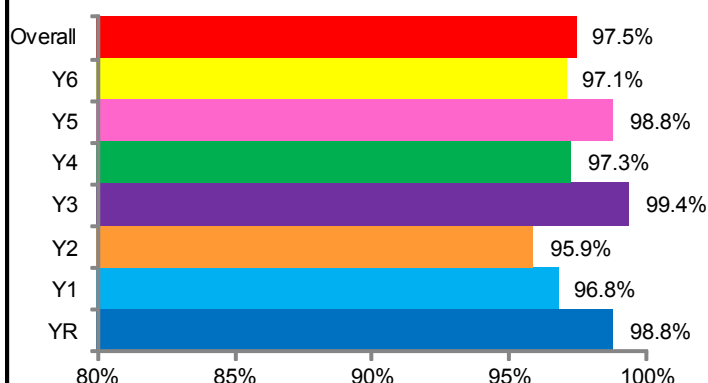

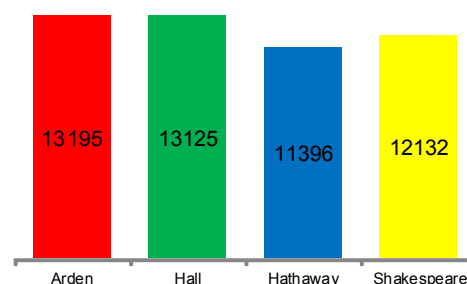
Weekly Attendance by Class
