Mrs Kennedy our Chair of Governors enjoyed being part of the assembly this morning and was extremely impressed by a presentation from our school bankers. They are encouraging the children to learn to save and reminding them that every other Tuesday we run a school bank here. In Year 3 they confidently applied their multiplication knowledge to different problems. Maddie in Y5 has just explained equivalent fractions to me. Mrs McCormack also talked to several pupils about their experience of maths in school and tested their recall of knowledge and skills. All of the teachers were able to explain why they were teaching a specific area and how it fits into a sequence of learning. We are currently writing progression skill maps in all our subjects and they will be available on our website for you to see where in the curriculum your child learns specific things and how that is developed from Reception to Year 6.

Some of our Year 6's have been extremely concerned about the amount of lost property we end up with and have sorted through everything, returned items and are now setting up cloakroom inspections to ensure that this reduced. Anything left unlabelled in our lost property will be going to charity. Can we please ask you to make sure you write in permanent marker your child's name so we can make sure that things don't go missina?



Their final mission was to decide where it is safe and unsafe to cross the road. They were fabulous road safety spies!






Year 6 - Arctic Artists in Action!
