
We have had lots of entries for our homework competition. Lots of pictures to make us feel happy and well in ourselves. The judges are looking forward to judging them next week. Watch this space



Football Team News

Stratford Primary 3 — Stratford Prep 1

The biggest derby to grace Primary school football took place on Monday: The Old Town derby a.k.a. el Stratford Clasico a.k.a. Stratford Primary vs. Stratford Prep. It was a nervy start by both teams, probably down to the magnitude of the game. The deadlock was broken by Arlo T, who danced through the heart of their midfield and defence before placing the ball beyond the goalkeeper's reach. However, as we were still in 'celebration mode', Stratford Prep hit us on the counter and equalised. We went into half time 1-1. After a rousing and inspirational team talk by co-managers Scarlett & Hodgkins, we came out of the blocks firing, communicating well with each other on the pitch, playing with more energy and passing well. Another Arlo T goal settled our nerves and we made sure to keep our concentration levels high and not go into the 'celebration mode' that cost us a goal in the first half! Soon after, Arlo T finished a good Stratford Primary passing move and scored his third hat trick in three games, bringing his personal goal tally to 11 in the last 3 games. We could've scored more as both Charlie W and Leo H went close but the game ended 3-1. A good second half gave us a deserved win and we head into Wednesday's clash with Bridgetown in good form.

Stratford Primary 1 — Bridgetown 1

Following the success of Monday's game against the Prep, we went into Wednesday's game against Bridgetown with enthusiasm. Both teams started brightly and the first half was a very closely fought battle. Chances missed at both ends and good defending from both teams meant that we went into halftime at 0-0. Shortly after the break, Arlo T burst through the Bridgetown defence and absolutely smashed the ball home, celebrating with a big thump of the chest and a massive cheer. We then held on terrificly well for the whole of the second half until, with only 2 minutes left on the clock, Bridgetown got their equaliser from a well hit shot from distance. The game ended 1-1 and was perhaps the most jusitified scoreline. As we told the children after the game, myself and Mr Hodgkins were incredibly proud of the team and the result against a very strong Bridgetown team. We are now undefeated in 4 games, winning 3 and drawing 1, and Arlo T's goal tally has now gone to 12 in 4 games. Bring on Thomas Jolyffe on Monday and Alveston on Wednesday!
